These pages represent a sample Project Abstract. It is intended as an introductory overview of a submitted project, and will be the jurors' first contact with any submitted work. It should include a Project Title, Project Description, and appropriate supporting material.

Above is the *Project Title*. It should provide a brief, unique, descriptive label for the project, such as 'A House in the Country' or 'New Townhouse Garden.' It will be included in the citation of awards. It is important that neither the description nor the title reveal project authorship or ownership; any such instances will be redacted to ensure a blind adjudication process.

This text represents the *Project Description*. It should briefly summarize the project, its scope, and the entrant's involvement. It should seek to explain lucidly and with brevity the aspects of the project that the entrant feels should be drawn to the jurors' attention. Font selection and size are at the entrant's discretion; the description should not run longer than a half page of text.

The rest of the *Project Abstract* can be completed at the discretion of the entrant. It should seek to quickly convey the spirit of the project. It may include any additional drawings, images, or text that the entrant wishes to include. Images may be captioned or left unlabeled. The entrant may use as few or as many additional elements as desired, provided that the project abstract is limited to two (2) single-sided 8.5"xII" pages in portrait orientation; please note that this includes the *Project* Title and Description. It is requested that individual formatting of the Project Abstract be kept to a minimum.
